

**RELATIONSHIP OF THE CONCEPT OF INCLUSIVE  
DEVELOPMENT AND PRINCIPLES OF GOOD GOVERNANCE**

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In the joint statement based on the results of the 22nd Ukraine-EU summit held on October 6, 2020, it was stated that civil society plays an important role in all spheres of social and political life. That is, the principle of inclusiveness - "leaving no one behind" has recently played a leading role in socio-political and economic development at the macro, meso and local levels. The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development defines: "Inclusive development is economic development in the framework of which equal opportunities arise for all segments of the population, material and immaterial goods are fairly distributed in society to increase its well-being" [1]. In particular, inclusive growth is designed to ensure fair opportunities for economic participants during economic growth and equality of sectors of the economy and different segments of the population, and focuses on equality of health, human capital, and ecological state of the environment, social protection and food security. An inclusive approach has a long-term perspective, as the main focus is on productive employment as a means of reducing social stratification by income level and raising the standard of living of the less well-off population, which will result in an improved environmental situation and a healthier society [2]. All this prompts efforts to implement the concept of inclusive development. The introduction of such an approach will bring with it the following possible results: it will give rise to economic growth without the use of drastic measures, diversification of the economy (for example, the development of tourism, intellectual development, more careful consideration of the problems of ecology and social injustice, increasing the level of employment).

In accordance with the decisions of the III Warsaw Summit of heads of governments and heads of member states of the Council of Europe, the Center for Local Self-Government Expertise and Reform developed the European Strategy for Innovation and Good Governance at the Local Level, which provides for compliance with 12 principles of good democratic governance [3]. This policy should be formed and implemented jointly by public authorities and civil society itself. After all, citizens should be at the center of all the most important democratic processes in society. The concept of inclusive growth and the principles of good governance strengthen and ensure more sustainable development of the socio-economic system, development of human capital.

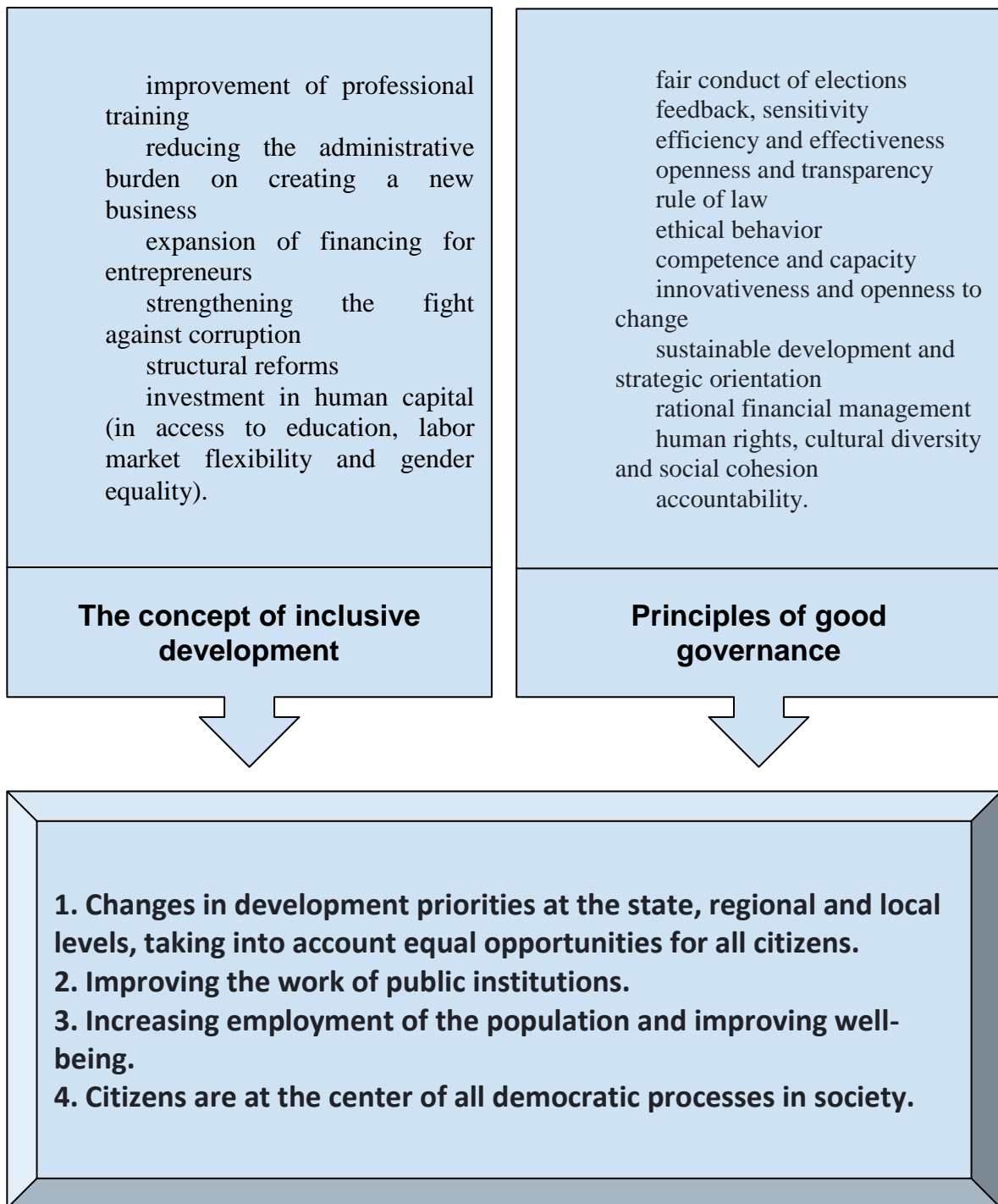


Figure 1. Interaction of the concept of inclusive development and the principles of good governance

Sustainable socio-economic growth does not happen spontaneously. This requires long-term commitment to the mentioned ideas on the part of the country's political leaders, perseverance, comprehensiveness in decision-making, and pragmatism. Each country has its own specific characteristics and historical experience, mentality, etc., which should be reflected in economic growth strategies, principles of good governance and inclusive development.
